## NEW SCHOOL BUILD

The Project Team and Project Board both met this week. Sure and steady progress continues to be made and those of you with a keen eye will have noticed the formal Planning Application Notice was posted in the press this week. Formal notification of such;

The latest communication Statement from the new build project team is as follows;

On 22nd January 2013 the Minister for Education, identified a new primary school to service Islandmagee and the surrounding area to include Mullaghdubh and Kilcoan Primary Schools, as one of the high priority projects to secure New Build Capital funding. This project was chosen through the Major Works Protocol. In September 2016, Mullaghdubh and Kilcoan Primary Schools amalgamated to become Islandmagee Primary School operating on a split campus. P1, P2, P3 and P4 operate on (Mullaghdubh) Junior site and P5, P6 P7 operate on the (Kilcoan) Senior site. This proposed project will deliver a handbook compliant five class base primary school on an EA site within the existing catchment area of Islandmagee Primary School's current enrolment. RIBA Design Stage 3 has been approved by the Department of Education in October 2020 and subsequently the design team have commenced RIBA Deign Stage 4 – Detailed design & contractor tender package. A planning application for this project was issued to Mid & East Antrim Council on 22.12.20.

The time that it has taken to get to this stage has certainly been frustrating, however, the Project Team have continued to meet monthly throughout the pandemic via online platforms which has allowed work to continue. ## YEAR 7: POST PRIMARY TRANSFER

This year sees the introduction of the new **online application** system for pupils transferring from Year 7 to Post Primary. Guidance for the application process will be available on the Education Authority Website on 2<sup>nd</sup> February. The portal for completion of applications opens on 1<sup>st</sup> **March and closes at 4pm on 16<sup>th</sup> March**. It is proposed that all post primary schools will have their admissions criteria finalised today; it is vital that you are aware of the criteria of the schools your child will be applying for and that you make clear reference to the criteria in your application.

I will be attending an online meeting with the Principals of Carrickfergus and Larne Grammar schools early next week to get clarification of their particular school's criteria and application processes.

I will keep you updated as information becomes available.

### Children of Key Workers & Vulnerable Children

The school continues to provide supervised learning each day for children of Key Workers and Vulnerable Children; those with SEN Stage 5 Statement.

Please be advised of the following information before applying for Key Worker provision:

- This provision is supervised learning only and children will complete the same activities as those learning from home. No additional face-to-face teaching will take place.
- Children to arrive at 9am unless previous agreement has been sought and normal home times will apply
- One parent in the household must be a key worker
- Children should bring their Home Learning Pack to school each day
- As per Department of Education guidance, Key Worker provision should only be applied for if all other childcare options have been totally exhausted.
- Your child will be required to wear school uniform and have a coat, hat, scarf, gloves and appropriate footwear for outside
- Children must bring their break and lunch with them each day.

# STRICTLY: If anyone in your household is experiencing symptoms you/your child must not come to school. We must be kept fully informed of any suspected cases.

#### **SAFEGUARDING & CHILD PROTECTION**

The safety and wellbeing of all our children is paramount. If you have ANY concerns about your child or for another child, please do not 'stay quiet' but instead get in touch.
